## SEC. 2. CONTINUATION IN EFFECT OF COUNTRY OF ORIGIN MARKING POLICY FOR IMPORTED GOODS PRODUCED IN THE WEST BANK OR GAZA.

5 with respect to country of origin marking of imported
6 goods produced in the West Bank or Gaza, notice of which
7 was published by U.S. Customs and Border Protection in
8 the Federal Register on December 23, 2020 (85 Fed. Reg.
9 83984), shall remain in effect until repealed by an Act
10 of Congress.

# 11 SEC. 3. PROHIBITION ON USE OF FUNDS TO RESCIND OR 12 CHANGE THE COUNTRY OF ORIGIN MARKING 13 POLICY FOR IMPORTED GOODS PRODUCED 14 IN THE WEST BANK OR GAZA.

15 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, none of 16 the funds authorized to be appropriated or otherwise made 17 available for the Department of State or U.S. Customs and Border Protection on or after the date of the enact-18 19 ment of this Act may be obligated or expended to prepare 20or promulgate any policy, guidance, regulation, notice, or 21 Executive order or to otherwise implement, administer, or 22 enforce any policy that rescinds or changes the policy of 23 the Government of the United States with respect to coun-24 try of origin marking of imported goods produced in the 25 West Bank or Gaza, notice of which was published by U.S.
